Rev. Kheniri Pipoints Tunisia On Map He Dreams Of Lifting Children Of Tunisia

If American fathers think they have a hard time providing for one wife and one or more children, think what a task it must be for a Tunisian father with four wives and a host of children.

According to the Rev. Michel Kheniri, of Tunisia many of the children are orphaned or have been abandoned by their parents and left to roam the streets, a prey to communism.

"It's a pitiful sight," he said, "to see these youngsters sitting in front of their mud huts looking into a hopeless future."

"I hope to establish a home for the children in Tunisia, the capital city, where they will receive the right kind of training and the 'supplies' can be best in the proper direction while it is yet time."

The minister explained that the custom of Muslims taking four wives was traditionally ruled out in 1856 but there are still many more than one wife among nomads who live on the outskirts of the city or wander around over the desert.

"They are barbaric," he added, "people with the traditional culture of North Africa, and live either in mud huts or tents."

Rev. Kheniri came to the United States some months ago seeking financial aid in establishing the children's home. Today he gave a progress report on his campaign.

"Besides the individual gifts we have received from interested persons, this week we received a commitment from the Christian Business Men's Committee of Miami Shores which has agreed to support one child on a monthly basis for a year. The cost for the child, a little girl, whom they have already adopted, will be \$30 a month."

"The number of children in the home increases two plans for 25 in the first house, the cost of maintaining a child will decrease for '70's cheaper by the dozen'."

Rev. Kheniri explained that he's not planning a mass institution but hopes to help each home small as so as to give better Christian and democratic training.

"Tunisi, he pointed out, is a modern city of 30,000 persons, where old buildings are being torn down to make room for new, up-to-date structures."

"The children," the minister stated, "are the potential fathers and mothers of his country. They will shape the future."

Rev. Kheniri is the only native Christian minister in Tunisia. He is the son of a Tunisian father and an English mother, both of whom are living in Tunisia.

RABBIS HERE TELL VIEWS Jewish-Christian Talks On Theology



Should Jewish and Christian leaders engage in theological dialogue or should they have their discussions solely on social and civic issues?

This question was asked of a number of local rabbis this week following a statement by Dr. Joseph Solovitchik of Boston, an Orthodox rabbi, who urged Orthodox Jews "to shut public debates, dialogues or symposia concerning doctrinal or critical aspects of our faith in connection with similar discussions of another faith."

Most of the rabbis approved and rejected the Boston rabbi's statement, believing that dialogue creates better understanding between Christians and Jews.

Rabbi Sid Landau, of Conservative Beth David Congregation, said "I emphatically reject Dr. Solovitchik's statement, believing that dialogue is most essential not for conversion purposes but for clarity of thought in the field of theological and philosophical points of view."

"I believe it creates better understanding of the areas of agreement and disagreement," said Rabbi Herbert H. Nabor, rabbi of the Reform congregation, Temple Beth El Orthodox, said he believes that only good can come out of communication.

"As long as we talk together in a spirit of mutual respect," he replied, "the net effect will be better understanding of one another's faith."

Rabbi Max Liquech of Conservative Beth Torah Congregation said he "was inclined to agree with the Boston rabbi."

"I question the advisability of theological dialogue which ends other than the clarification of the preferred commitments of the discussion."

"These discussions of theology are charged with emotion, I hope they won't create a feeling of antagonism rather than a feeling of a clearer feeling of understanding."

"There is a great need for clergyman to discuss the ethical, moral and philosophical issues which cause the participants or the audience to have less understanding of each other."

Dr. Joseph H. Nabor of Temple Israel of Greater Miami (Reformed) favors dialogue in moderation but said he believes it should be along other lines than the chosen people concept of the Messiah and theology in depth.

He was hesitant to discuss the question too far as he was speaking upon the topic at his temple this week.
